Steffan Shaw - Chair

Steffan Shaw, an active CSIA member since 2010, assumed the position of Chair of the Alberta board in October 2023.

John Krupa - Treasurer

Family, education, and skiing have been the enduring themes in the life of John Krupa, currently serving as the CSIA Alberta Southern Zone representative and Treasurer of the Board. Kyle Arink

Kyle Arink's skiing journey commenced at the tender age of 4 on the slopes behind his grandparents' house in Lansdowne, Edmonton. Enthralled by the sport, he joined the Snow Valley Ski Club in 1995. In 2006, Kyle achieved certification as a Level 1 ski coach and instructor with both the CSCF and CSIA, marking the beginning of his career at the Snow Valley Ski School.

Teaming up with lifelong friend Rob Hazen, Kyle co-founded a successful masters racing and learn-to-race program at Snow Valley, creating a vibrant community of over 200 members. He furthered his qualifications, obtaining his Level 2 CSIA and DL certification with the CSCF. For more than a decade, Kyle embarked on a teaching journey alongside Rachelle Simard, exploring destinations like Niseko, Perisher, and Lake Louise.

In 2016, Kyle reached the pinnacle of his ski instruction career with the achievement of his Level 4 CSIA, a symbolic full-circle moment. Fueled by a desire to give back, he took on leadership roles, including a directorship with the Alberta Board for the CSIA in 2019. Initiatives like Spring Fling, PDPs, AB clinics, Project Y, and Level 3 Academy underscore Kyle's commitment to fostering the development of ski professionals and uniting the Alberta ski community.

Kyle has been a dedicated member of the CSIA Alberta Board for 4 years and will be sitting a 5th year until the upcoming April 13th AGM. He has served as past secretary of the board.

Jennifer Collison - Member at Large

Jennifer Collison, a member at Large of the Alberta Regional Board, Mountain Zone, began her ski teaching career at 16 years old. She started part-time at Snow Valley in Edmonton, AB, eventually transitioning to a full-time instructor role at the Sunshine Village Ski and Snowboard School in 1994. In 2017, she assumed the position of Head Trainer.

Jen's dedication to the art of teaching is evident in her active involvement with the CSIA. From 2016 to 2019, she volunteered for the CSIA Education Committee and currently collaborates with the CSIA TEC Committee on various projects. Since joining the Alberta Board, Jennifer has already made a significant impact by relaunching the Level 3 Academy Pilot program. This initiative aims to support Level 3 candidates across the region who require training and lack access to a Level 4 Instructor.

Her focus extends beyond the slopes, as she aspires to pursue programs and funding directly related to active instructors in the ski industry and communities across the province of Alberta.

Ben Atherton
